Gavan also is the founder of Tribal Minds, an innovative Las Vegas-based consulting firm specializing in ground-up strategies, brand and sponsorship management, social responsibility and cause-oriented marketing. She has developed sharp expertise in "cause mobilization" and community advocacy, and in taking ideas from concept to implementation. She is known for her innovative and strategic abilities to connect people with ideas. Some of her former projects and clients include: Delano Las Vegas,

Alexander Dawson; HELP of Southern Nevada; Workforce Connections; and Fremont East Entertainment District. As Vice President of Noteware Development, she managed \$150 million in projects in Las Vegas and Phoenix. As Director of Sales & Marketing at Sky Las Vegas Condominiums -- a \$325 million dollar mixed-use high-rise development on the Las Vegas Strip -- she managed operations, marketing and sales for a 45-story tower. District; and a founding board member and past Vice President of the Nevada Professional Coaches Association. Today, she is active in the Downtown Las Vegas Alliance and is a trustee for HELP of Southern Gavan has received numerous honors and citations for her community work. She was recognized in the March 2014 VRated Magazine's "Faces of Las Vegas"; bestowed with Vegas Magazine's "Vegas Gives" award in November 2013; named a "Woman to Watch" in 2011 by In Business Magazine; and identified as a local hero in December of 2011 by City Life Magazine. In 2012, her Project Dinner Table was voted the "Best Way to Give and Eat" by the Las Vegas Review Journal and by SEVEN Magazine in 2011. The national luxury magazine Travel + Leisure named Project Dinner Table as one of the "Must See + Do" in Las Vegas in February 2013.

### them nearby and I sometime envy people who have children and grandchildren who can drop by for dinner, or just get together to watch a movie or swim in the


