Hernandez, Esq., representing consumers facing identity theft (focusing on Veterans), illegal debt collection practices and credit reporting errors. Mr. Hernandez indicated identity theft affects Veterans two times more than the general public. He provided tips of how to know if you are a victim of identity theft, including the Equifax breach (equifaxsecurity2017.com), such as annual credit report inquiry (annualcreditreport.com), and what to do if you are a victim, such as fraud alert and credit freeze requests, making an identity theft report to the FTC and police, ways identity theft occurs and how to protect your identification as well as how to improve your credit score.

• **President Jim** presented our speaker with a "Share What You Can" award to benefit a veteran in need and then adjourned the meeting.
