Mujahid Ramadan is the founder and CEO of M.R. Consulting, a diversity training and consulting firm. He also served as the chairman of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's Multicultural Advisory Council.

Prior to starting his consulting firm, Ramadan served as CEO of Nevada Partners Organization, Inc. where he managed the construction of a 20,000 job training facility and then managed a staff of 25. He developed and implemented the welfare-to-work initiative programs, designed and facilitated the Metro Police Department's Academy Diversity program and participated in the design and implementation of MGM MIRAGE Diversity and Hiring Promotion Outreach in Southern Nevada and in Detroit Michigan.

Prior to Nevada Partners, Ramadan was appointed Nevada State Drug Policy Director, aka State Drug Czar, by Governor Bill Miller. There he administered governor's drug policy commission and its funding of a \$13 million dollar yearly budget for law enforcement, education and treatment.

Prior to joining the Governor's cabinet, Ramadan served as U.S. Senator Harry's Reid's regional representative.

Ramadan served as an advisor to the President Obama's Faith Community Initiative, a board member of the Inter-Faith Council for Workers Justice, a participant in the National Leadership Summit on Race Relations and America's Public Education System, and a trainer for the Justice Department Violent Crimes Program.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Years ago, I went to a conference where the speaker, David Rendell, articulated that the things that make us “different” are not problems or disadvantages. Rather he suggested that those things that make us “different” will often be the raw material of our lives that can provide us with our greatest sources of advantage, effectiveness and joy.

There is an ancient scripture that says “If men come unto me, I will show unto them their weakness. I give unto men weakness that they may be humble; and my grace is sufficient for all men that humble themselves before me . . . and have faith in me, then will I make weak things become strong unto them.” (Ether 12:27)

Rendell’s speech made me think that often our weaknesses are inextricably tied to our strengths. Sometimes if we fix our weaknesses, we diminish our strengths.

Think of this. People go to the Leaning Tower of Pisa because it leans. That is its weakness but also its strength. More than 80 years ago, the Italian leader/dictator, Benito Mussolini, attempted to straighten the lean because he felt it was an embarrassment. Luckily his efforts failed. Government leaders today state that “It is important to keep the current tilt, due to the vital role that this element played in promoting the tourism industry of Pisa.” Another point to consider is that the Leaning Tower of Pisa is only 182 feet tall, making it the smallest “tower” to achieve

Almost a decade ago, Kimmel was the marquee comedian during President Obama's White House Correspondents Dinner. Kimmel wrapped up the dinner with this joke:

"I also want to thank Mr. Mills, my 10th grade high school history teacher, who said I'd never amount to anything if I kept screwing around in class. Mr. Mills, I'm about to high-five the president of the United States. Eat it, Mills."



If he would have straightened up and changed his behavior, would he have his own TV show or hosted the President's Correspondents dinner?

As Rotarians, our goal is to cultivate a diverse and equitable culture in which underrepresented groups have greater opportunities to participate as members and leaders.

Often, the key to our success is to appreciate and accentuate the difference in ourselves and those with whom we associate that is inherent in who we are to allow ourselves to discover opportunities that value such diversity.


