MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Every year, March has always been a fun time for me, a sports fan. This week is called championship week when all the college basketball conferences play their tournaments to determine who can represent their conference in the 68-team NCAA tournament. Championship week is the kickoff to March Madness.

There are 350 Division 1 college basketball teams. They started their seasons five months ago with the goal of winning their conference. They all want to win but less than 20 percent win enough to make the tournament.

The key to winning say the winningest coach of all time, John Wooden, "The little details that are vital. Little things make big things happen."

Author and activist Helen Keller shared this on the importance of doing ordinary things in an extraordinary way:

"I long to accomplish a great and noble task; but it is my chief duty and joy to accomplish humble tasks as though they were great and noble. The world is moved along, not only by the mighty shoves of its heroes, but also by the aggregate of the tiny pushes of each honest worker."

So often we persuade ourselves that change is only meaningful if there is some large, visible outcome associated with it. Whether it is losing weight, building a business, traveling the world or any other goal, we often put pressure on ourselves to make some earth-shattering improvement that everyone will talk about.

Meanwhile, improving by just a little isn't notable (and sometimes it isn't even *noticeable*). But it can be just as meaningful, especially in the long run.




