






Michael Bahr

Michael Bahr has been called "Peter Pan, the Pied Piper, and the Energizer Bunny, all rolled into one." He is the Interim Managing

Director of the Tony award-winning Utah Shakespeare Festival. He served as the education director of the Utah Shakespearean Festival for 24 years, creating and managing numerous education programs, including the orientation/seminar program, The Wooden O Symposium scholars conference, Shakespeare in the Schools Tour serving 20,000 students annually



with touring performances, The Shakespeare Competition, an academic event that serves 3,500 students from 120 schools across the Intermountain West, and extensive theatre education camps and classes. He has taught in public school systems in northern Utah and southern California and holds a Bachelor of Arts and Master of Education degrees from Southern Utah University. He has received numerous teaching awards, including Outstanding Teacher Award, nominee for the Huntsman Award, the Apple Award (for excellence in education), and others. He is also a leading member of the Utah State Office of Education POPS (Professional Outreach Program in the Schools) committee. In 2009 he was called to testify before the United States Congress about the economic impact of the arts in rural areas.


