Four Way Test Speech Contest

Today is the Club Level contest for the District Four Way Test Speech Contest. The theme for the 2024-2025 Rotary year is "The Magic of Rotary", which will also be the topic for this year's Four Way Test Speech Contest. RI President Stephanie Urchick celebrates the magic of Rotary. She says members create that magic with every project completed, every dollar donated, and every new member of Rotary. Any topic related to this theme will be acceptable, provided that it is not profane, obscene, unpatriotic or racist. In the speech, the topic must be specifically subjected to the Rotary Four-Way Test. This must be during the body of the speech and is not to be reserved for concluding statements only.

Speeches must be at least 6 minutes and no more than 8 minutes in length. Penalty points will be subtracted for time infractions at the rate of two points for every fifteen seconds or fraction thereof that a contestant's speech runs either under the 6-minute minimum or over the 8-minute maximum. Notes can be used during the Club and Level Group level competitions. At the Regional level, only a single 3x5 card both sides may be used. At the District level, notes will not be allowed.

2025 Contest Timeline:

- Club Level Contests must be completed by January 31
- Area/Group Level Contests must be completed by February 28
- Regional Level Contests must be completed by March 31
- District Finals April 11 at District Assembly

Virginia Woolf was a renowned English writer and a pivotal figure in modern literature. Woolf pioneered the stream-of-consciousness writing style, exploring the inner thoughts and emotions of her characters with unprecedented depth and fluidity.

She was a vocal advocate for women's rights, particularly their right to economic and intellectual independence. Her essay "A Room of One's Own" is a seminal work of feminist literature that argues women need financial security and a space of their own to pursue creative endeavors. During the inter-war period she did her best work in the 1920s. This made her a feminist icon.

She and her husband, Leonard, founded The Hogarth Press, this publishing house provided a platform for emerging and established authors, including many women writers, who might not have been heard otherwise. This act can be seen as a form of social and intellectual justice.

Woolf's advocacy for women's independence can be viewed as a form of social and political charity. By empowering women, she aimed to create a more equitable and just society.

Woolf's emphasis on individual expression and the importance of fostering diverse voices resonates with the ideals of Rotary, which strive to bring together individuals with diverse skills and talents to create a positive impact on the world.


