## Kate Zhong, MD, MSc, FRCP(C) Jeffrey Cummings, MD, ScD

Brain Health & Alzheimer's




**Dr. Kate Zhong** is a geriatric psychiatrist, pharmacologist, and trailblazer in Alzheimer's and brain health research. She is the Director of Innovation and a Research Professor in the Department of Brain Health at the Chambers-Grundy Center for Transformative Neuroscience, Kirk Kerkorian School of Medicine, University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Dr. Zhong has held pivotal roles shaping the landscape of clinical research and brain health innovation. She served as **Senior Director of Clinical Research at the Cleveland Clinic Lou Ruvo Center for Brain Health**, leading programs in Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, multiple sclerosis, and traumatic brain injury. She later became **Chief Strategy Officer for the Global** 

**Alzheimer's Platform (GAP)**, helping accelerate clinical trials and bring innovative treatments to patients worldwide. At UNLV, she created the **"Brain Health and You"** community education series and established the Innovation Day Program. She has been recognized as an **Alzheimer's Ambassador** for her lasting contributions to the field.

Her leadership extends beyond science. As a founding member and Brain Health Champion of the **AARP Global Council on Brain Health**, she continues to shape the national dialogue on aging and brain health.

Dr. Zhong's achievements have been recognized with numerous honors, including the **Women of Distinction Award, the Minority Lifetime Achievement Award**, and recognition among the **Top 100 Women** and **Top 100 Doctors in Vegas** (2022–2024). She was also profiled in the PBS documentary *MAKERS: Women Who Make America* as one of Nevada's most influential women.



**Jeffrey Cummings, MD**, is the Joy Chambers-Grundy Professor of Brain Science, Director of the Chambers-Gundy Center for Transformative Neuroscience, and Co-Director of the Pam Quirk Brain Health and Biomarker Laboratory, Department of Brain Health, Kirk Kerkorian School of Medicine, University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV).

Dr. Cummings is a Neurologist globally recognized for his contributions to Alzheimer's research, drug development, and clinical trials. He leads the UNLV Clinical Trials Observatory, which studies all drugs in current clinical trials for Alzheimer's disease to inform drug development decisions better. Dr. Cummings has been honored with the Henderson Award of the American Geriatrics

Society, the Distinguished Scientist Award of the American Association of Geriatric Psychiatry, the Leadership and Achievement Award by the International Society of CNS Drug Development, the Bengt Winblad Lifetime Achievement Award from the national Alzheimer's Association. International Psychogeriatric Association Distinguished Service Award, and the Alzheimer's Drug Discovery Foundation's Melvin R. Goodes Prize for Excellence in Drug Development. Dr. Cummings is a Fellow of the American Academy for the Advancement of Science.

Dr. Cummings was the founding director of the Mary S. Easton Center for Alzheimer's Disease Research at UCLA and the Cleveland Clinic Lou Ruvo Center for Brain Health. He has completed training in Neurology (Boston University) and Behavioral Neurology (Boston University), with additional training in Neuropsychiatry and Neuropathology (National Hospital for Nervous Diseases, Queen Square, London).

Dr. Cummings has published 43 books and over 900 peer-reviewed papers on Alzheimer's disease, neuropsychiatry, and clinical trials.



## **Rotary History**

#### From Comfort Stations to Global Sanitation



In 1907—just two years after Paul Harris founded the first Rotary Club in Chicago—members took on their very first community service project: building public "comfort stations," or restrooms, in downtown Chicago. It may sound modest today, but at the time, the city had few public facilities, and Rotary's effort dramatically improved sanitation, safety, and dignity for everyday citizens.

That single project did more than provide relief, transforming Rotary from a fellowship of professionals into the world's first **Service Club**, setting the

course for more than a century of action-driven compassion.

Today, that legacy continues on a global scale. Each year on **November 19**, the world observes **United** Nations World Toilet Day, spotlighting the 4.2 billion people who still live without safe sanitation and the 673 million who must defecate in the open.

Access to toilets remains one of the simplest, yet most powerful, ways to protect health, preserve dignity, and strengthen communities.




