Jhone Ebert brings over three decades of experience, passion, and proven leadership to her Superintendent of the Clark County School District (CCSD) role. A longtime Southern Nevada resident and CCSD educator, Superintendent Ebert has dedicated her career to ensuring that every student—no matter their background or zip code—has the opportunity to succeed in school and life.

As Superintendent of CCSD, the fifth-largest school district in the nation—Ebert brings deep experience and a strong track record of improving educational outcomes across Nevada. She approaches her role with a clear focus on expanding college and career readiness opportunities, advancing innovation and equity in classrooms, and fostering a culture where every employee feels valued and every student has the support they need to thrive.

Before being selected as Superintendent in 2025, Ebert served as Nevada's Superintendent of Public Instruction, overseeing the academic progress of nearly 500,000 students across the state's 17 school districts. Under her leadership, Nevada transformed its 54-year-old education funding formula into a more equitable, student-focused model—the Pupil-Centered Funding Plan. Her tenure also saw bold investments in teacher recruitment and retention, as well as expanded access to career and technical education. She positioned Nevada as a national leader in computer science education, ensuring that more than 95% of high school students had access to foundational coursework that prepares them for the future.



Rotary History

From the beginning, the Las Vegas Rotary Club has understood the value of telling its own story, and our longtime newsletter,



The Wheel, has helped us do just that. The earliest preserved issue—then titled *The Wheel of Rotary*—dates to July 7, 1949, and is housed in UNLV's Special Collections. Sometime after 1955, the name was shortened simply to The Wheel, but its purpose and spirit remained unchanged.

Much of that early spark came from Charles "Pop" Squires, one of the city's original storytellers. Later editors kept the momentum going, and in 1998 **PP Jim Tucker** gave *The Wheel* a full Las Vegas makeover—multipage, full color, and polished. District 5300 clearly noticed: we brought home the "Best Newsletter" Award for 2016–2017.

Today, under President Janice Lencke, The Wheel is still doing what it does best—capturing our history, celebrating our people, and sharing weekly gems like "Did You Know?", "Say Hello!", "Rotary Etiquette Essentials," and "Check It Out!" It remains our club's living memory and friendly narrator, reminding us where we've been, who we are, and the impact we create when we *Unite For Good*.

Scribe Notes
