Ciara Byrne is the Co-Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Green Our Planet, a nationally scaled education platform that reconnects young people to the planet through hands-on learning in STEM, sustainability, nutrition, and financial literacy.

Over the past decade, Ciara has helped steward more than \$30 million in philanthropic, public, and partnership funding to bring Green Our Planet's programs to 1,300+ schools across 44 states, serving 400,000+ students and 14,000 educators. The organization integrates school gardens, hydroponics laboratories, and technology-enabled curricula to help students—particularly those in underserved communities—develop scientific literacy, environmental awareness, and a sense of agency in the world around them.

Under Ciara's leadership, Green Our Planet has recently partnered with sister company Green Our Planet Studios to pioneer the use of AI Teaching Assistants to support educators and students. These include Dr. Splash, Bugsy, and Quasar—AI-powered guides embedded within the learning platform that help teachers plan lessons, support inquiry-based learning, and bring complex concepts in science, sustainability, and financial literacy to life in accessible, student-centered ways.

Since its inception in 2013, Green Our Planet has grown from a grassroots initiative into a multi-state platform blending education innovation, climate resilience, and community-based economic opportunity—where students don't just learn, but run farmers markets, grow food for their communities, and see themselves as contributors to real-world solutions.

Before founding Green Our Planet, Ciara served as CEO of Lion Television USA, leading U.S. operations for an international film production company and securing long-term partnerships generating \$30–40 million annually. She was selected as a 2019 Obama Fellow, chosen from more than 5,000 applicants worldwide for her leadership and impact. An immigrant from Ireland who has lived in eight countries, Ciara brings a global, cross-cultural perspective to building models that are innovative, deeply human, and designed to last.

Rotary History

Mayor's Cup: A Global Game



The Very Beginning

What began as a bold civic vision has grown into one of the most influential youth soccer tournaments in North America. The Las Vegas Mayor's Cup International Soccer Tournament, held this year February 12–17, was launched in 2000 under then-Mayor Oscar Goodman to showcase Las Vegas's expanding soccer facilities and attract international youth competition. From its earliest days, the tournament looked beyond local play—creating a stage where young athletes from around the world could compete, connect, and experience Las Vegas as a global destination.

How Our Club Became Involved

Everything changed in 2006. During Brock Fraser's year as president, Roger Tabor—of the Downtown Rotary Club and President of the Downtown Las Vegas Soccer Club—introduced the Mayor's Cup to the Las Vegas Rotary Club. What began as a simple presentation quickly became a powerful partnership. From that moment forward, Las Vegas Rotary stepped in to host international teams—opening doors for young athletes who otherwise may never have had the opportunity to compete on a global stage.

Over the years, the club has welcomed teams from Russia, Colombia, France, and Germany. When Borussia Mönchengladbach, one of Germany's premier professional soccer academies, joined the tournament, the Mayor's Cup truly stepped onto the world stage. Known internationally as the team to beat, their participation elevated the tournament's reputation and competitive level almost overnight. The Las Vegas Rotary Club holds priority hosting for Borussia Mönchengladbach and has embraced that role wholeheartedly. **Members serve as host families, drivers, guides, and cultural ambassadors.** What could have been simply a tournament has become a genuine cultural exchange rooted in service and friendship.

The Scope and Importance of the Tournament

Behind the scenes, the Mayor's Cup remains a true family effort. Roger Tabor, his wife Amy, and now their son Colin coordinate the tournament each year—traveling worldwide to promote the event, build relationships, and personally invite teams. Their dedication ensures the Mayor's Cup remains both fiercely competitive and genuinely international. For visiting teams—especially the German educators and coaches—the experience extends far beyond the scoreboard. Players practice English, immerse themselves in American culture, and, by their own admission, enthusiastically explore American stores. Combined with Rotary hospitality, the tournament becomes a meaningful cultural exchange that leaves lasting impressions while supporting the local economy.

Today, the Mayor's Cup serves both boys and girls across two weekends in February and one weekend in October. Elite teams arrive from across the United States and around the globe. Older age groups are heavily scouted, with hundreds of college coaches attending annually. Many players credit the tournament with early exposure that led to collegiate opportunities and professional pathways. Several of "our boys" have gone on to compete at professional and Olympic levels, earning multi-million-dollar contracts. Internationally recognized as one of the largest and most impactful youth soccer tournaments of its kind, the Mayor's Cup is often compared to top global events for its scale, diversity, and developmental value. Its strength lies not in exclusivity, but in opportunity—bringing together different cultures, playing styles, and perspectives on one global stage.

2026: When the World Comes to Las Vegas

This year, the Las Vegas Rotary Club will once again host the U15 boys' team from Borussia Mönchengladbach. The February 2026 Mayor's Cup will welcome an extraordinary 980 teams, including 64 international teams, competing on 77 fields and playing more than 2,200 games.

Hundreds of scouts will line the sidelines as families, coaches, and supporters fill hotels, restaurants, and venues throughout the valley. Beyond the fields, the 2026 tournament is projected to generate more than \$60 million for the Las Vegas economy—while giving young athletes confidence, perspective, friendships, and lifelong memories.

This is Rotary's mission in action: supporting youth, opening doors, and building global goodwill.

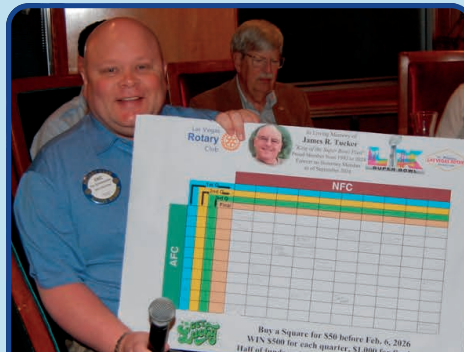

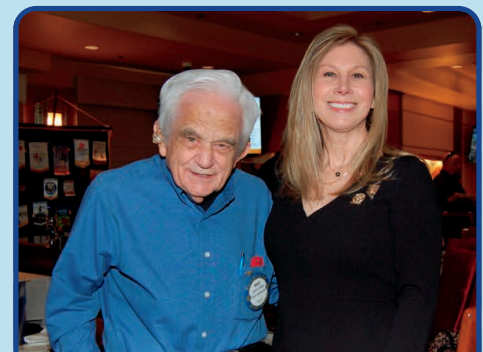

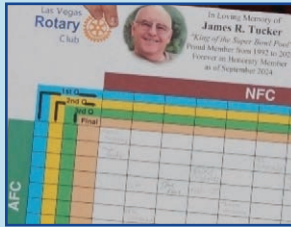

Member Spotlight

PP Jim Tucker — A True Rotarian

March 23, 1946 – December 18, 2025

James R. "Jim" Tucker led Rotary the way he lived—with heart, humor, and unwavering spirit.



When Jim became President of the Las Vegas Rotary Club during the 2002–2003 Rotary year, the world was still recovering from the events of September 11, 2001. Through that uncertain time, Jim provided calm leadership and steady optimism, ensuring continued support of Rotary International's annual and permanent funds. A steward of tradition and a champion of progress, he also focused on strengthening the club's future—updating the club banner, digitizing the membership roster, and improving daily operations. During Jim's presidency, the Wetzel Award was established in honor of Rotarian **Scotty Wetzel**, reflecting Jim's belief in recognizing those who helped shape our club.

Jim's Rotary service spanned decades and many roles, including President of the 25 Club (1994), Club Director (1996–2004), Club President (2002–2003), and Trustee of the Las Vegas Rotary Foundation (2001–2003). He was honored with the Marathon Award (2004–2005) and recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow, Las Vegas Rotary Foundation Benefactor, and Rotary International Benefactor. Yet it was often the quieter contributions that defined him—guiding *The Wheel* as editor, serving as the club's resident photographer, and proudly overseeing the annual Super Bowl Board to benefit the Foundation.

When Jim formally resigned on July 30, 2024, the club unanimously named him an Honorary Member the following September—a reflection not of an ending, but of a legacy that continues to ripple through our Rotary family with gratitude, admiration, and love.
