- Rotarian often pays for their guests or the guest pays

Definition: Guest of the Club

- Invited by our club or a member under the following circumstances:
 - Perspective new member
 - Honored community leaders
 - Honored guests invited by the board or committee chairs
 - Related to Speaker or Club President
- Our club covers the cost of their meal
- Membership co-chairs or the host Rotarian is responsible for greeting and introducing a guest of the Club



Rotary History

FRIENDS AND FAMILY OF ROTARY



You only need to look at Rotary's polio eradication effort to understand the scale of volunteer power required to immunize more than 2.5 billion children worldwide. From the beginning, Rotary's impact has relied not only on its members, but on the steady support of family, friends, and community partners.

In Rotary's early years, women were not permitted to be members, yet that did not deter Rotarians' wives from actively supporting projects and fellowship. Over time, this involvement became known

as the "Rotary Anns." The name dates to 1914, when San Francisco Rotarians traveled by train to the Houston convention. Ann Brunnier—the wife of a Rotarian Henry Brunnier, and the only woman aboard for part of the journey—was introduced along the way as "the Rotarian's Ann." The name stuck, becoming a worldwide term that recognized the essential role spouses played in Rotary life. Following the 1987 policy change welcoming women as members, the term gradually became part of Rotary history. **Pictured is the original Rotary Ann and her husband.**

Today, our Club proudly carries that spirit forward through Friends and Family of Rotary. 




