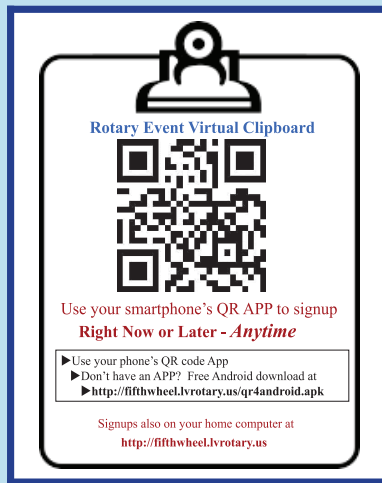
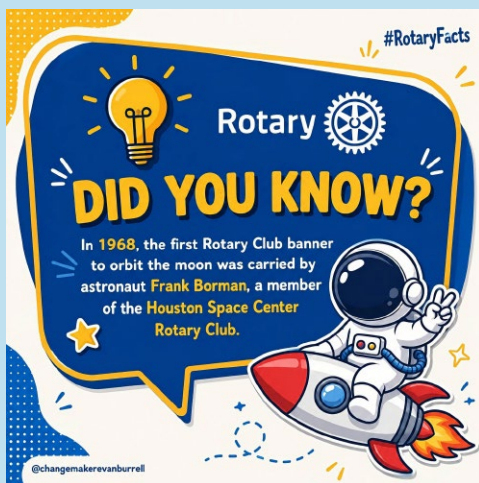
Weekly Showcase

The Club welcomed the personal guests of five Club Members, as well as one guest of the Club, and **President Greg** introduced those seated at the President's Table.

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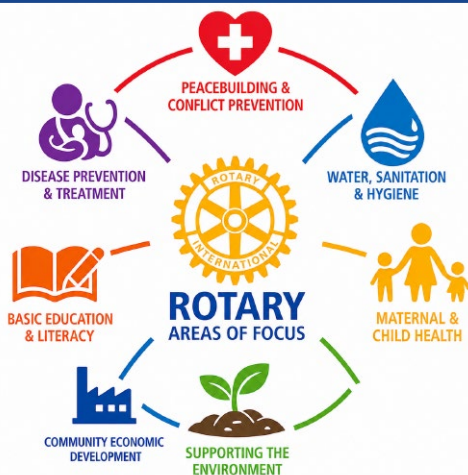
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LA5 Rotary Club of Los Angeles, Los Angeles, CA

Los Angeles is located in southwestern, California and is known around the world as the center of the entertainment industry. The city is nicknamed the "City of Angels," because its original full Spanish name translates to "The Angels". The Rotary Club of Los Angeles, commonly known as LA5, is part of District 5280 and is one of the oldest and most prestigious Rotary clubs in the world. Founded in 1909, LA5 was the fifth Rotary club established globally, giving rise to its well-known nickname. More than a century later, it remains one of Rotary International's largest and most influential clubs, bringing together over 300 leaders from business, government, law, education, healthcare, and nonprofit organizations.

Service remains at the heart of LA5's mission. Through the Rotary Club of Los Angeles Foundation, which manages an endowment of more than \$10 million, distributes hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to support community and international projects. Over the years, the foundation has funded scholarships, youth programs, health initiatives, educational opportunities, and community organizations throughout the greater Los Angeles area.

One of the club's signature service projects is Angel City Celebration, one of the largest holiday outreach events in Southern California. Working alongside other Rotary clubs, community organizations, and corporate partners, LA5 helps provide toys, books, school supplies, clothing, bicycles, and food assistance to thousands of underserved children and families in South Los Angeles each year. The event regularly mobilizes hundreds of volunteers and serves as a shining example of Rotary's commitment to improving lives in local communities.

Internationally, LA5 has supported projects focused on clean water, healthcare, education, and economic development. One of its most successful global initiatives raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for a water project in Myanmar, helping provide access to safe drinking water and improved sanitation for communities in need.

The Rotary Club of Dublin Central

Dublin sits on the eastern coast of Ireland, along the River Liffey. It has many nicknames but my favorite is The Big Smoke. The term was historically used by the rural Irish to describe the capital back when it was packed with breweries, tanneries, and domestic coal fires, creating a noticeable layer of smoke and emissions over the urban center. In preparation for our member trip to Ireland, I thought it would be fun to showcase The Rotary Club of Dublin Central. The Rotary Club of Dublin Central is a "newer" club, founded 2001, and part of district 1160.

One of the club's most inspiring local projects is the Nurture Garden at Phoenix Park Specialist School. The school serves students with complex learning needs, and the garden was designed to provide a safe, engaging outdoor environment where students can learn, explore, and connect with nature. The project reflects the club's commitment to enhancing opportunities for children and young adults with disabilities while enriching their educational experience.

The club is also known for its annual fundraising concert featuring the Celtic Choristers. Held near St. Stephen's Green during the holiday season, this popular event brings together community members and visitors for an evening of music and fellowship. The concert has become a cherished tradition, raising funds for local and international charitable projects while showcasing the talents of one of Ireland's most respected choirs.

International service is another cornerstone of the club's work. One of its most significant projects has been supporting access to clean water in Sanddam, Kenya. Working alongside local partners and fellow Rotarians, the club has helped fund improvements to water infrastructure that provide reliable access to safe drinking water for families in the region.
