Member Spotlight

Dr. George Kychakoff - CEO | Biotechnix



Say hello to Dr. George Kychakoff, a scientist, inventor, and entrepreneur whose life began in Harbin, China and has circled the globe ever since. George earned his bachelor's degree in physics with honors from the Australian National University, where he also completed his military service, then came to the United States for a master's in engineering and applied science at Yale and a PhD in mechanical engineering at Stanford, where he subsequently served on the Mechanical Engineering faculty, authoring more than 40 technical papers and serving as Chairman of the International Congress on the Applications of Lasers and Electro-optics.

After leaving Stanford, George served as an executive with two Fortune 500 companies. In 1995 George founded Enertech, designing equipment and services for diagnosing and controlling industrial combustion processes for the pulp, paper, and energy industries and earning 20 patents. He grew the company over more than two decades until its commercial business was acquired in 2018 by Valmet, the leading global supplier of technologies for those industries. He also founded Biotechnix, Inc. whose government funded research and development spanned security and military applications, environmental monitoring, industrial process control, and medical diagnostics. Today, his business interests focus primarily on early-stage biotechnology company investment.

George is also a seasoned Rotarian. Before joining us he served eight years in the Maple Valley, Washington club and two years in Fair Oaks, Texas, leading the development of six Global Grants. He is a Paul Harris Fellow. He and his wife Viki now make their home near the heart of Las Vegas. Ask George how laser spectroscopy works, what it takes to earn a patent, or what brought a Stanford engineer to the desert. Whatever the answer, you will leave lunch smarter. Foundation Approves Expanded Tiberti Fellow Recognition

The Las Vegas Rotary Foundation Board has approved three new giving levels above the longtime \$1,000 Tiberti Fellow threshold. A review of Foundation giving back to 2001 showed why the change was **warranted**: 109 of our 240 donors have already crossed the \$1,000 mark, making it roughly the median gift on file. **However, we have no good way of recognizing our most generous members**, who together account for \$248,000, or 41% of everything the Foundation has ever raised.

Following a proposal from Mike Ballard and David Thorson, the Board voted unanimously **to enhance our recognition program to better thank our more generous members and to provide an incentive structure to encourage additional giving. The new levels are:**

- Tiberti Sustainer, A new level created to encourage new and first-time donors (\$100)
- Tiberti Fellow (\$1,000)
- Tiberti Builder (\$5,000)
- Cornerstone Society (\$10,000),
- 1923 Society (\$25,000), named for the year our club was founded.

The goal is simple, to **recognize** our most engaged donors, and provide **all members with** visible next aspirational steps, while recognizing the full range of generosity that sustains our Foundation's work.

President Greg closed the meeting at 1:30pm.



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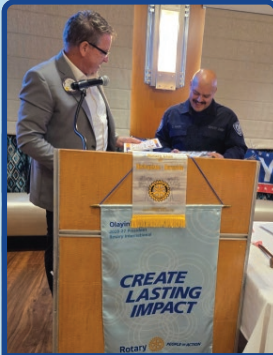

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Rotary Club of Rushmore

Nestled at the eastern edge of South Dakota's Black Hills, Rapid City serves as the gateway to some of America's most iconic landscapes. Mount Rushmore National Memorial, Crazy Horse Memorial, Custer State Park, Badlands National Park, and Wind Cave National Park are

all within easy reach, drawing millions of visitors each year. While tourism is central to the region's economy, Rapid City is equally defined by a strong sense of community, where volunteers and civic organizations work together to make the Black Hills an even better place to live and visit. That spirit is exemplified by the Rotary Club of Rushmore. Chartered on March 12, 1986, the club is part of District 5610 and has earned a reputation for hands-on service and ambitious community partnerships.



The club's most recognizable legacy is its long-standing partnership with Storybook Island, one of the Black Hills' most beloved children's attractions. For decades, Rushmore Rotarians have helped preserve and improve the park through fundraising, volunteer service, and capital projects. Recent contributions include the construction of the Rotary Gazebo and the installation of a multilingual Peace Pole, while members continue to volunteer during seasonal events that welcome thousands of families each year. Their commitment has helped ensure that Storybook Island remains a free destination where generations of children can discover the magic of classic nursery rhymes and fairy tales.

The Rotary Club of Rushmore also looks beyond the Black Hills. Members have pledged \$500,000 toward the new Children's Home Society of South Dakota campus, support Feeding South Dakota, and partner in Rotary's global humanitarian efforts. Internationally, the club supports The School of St. Jude in Tanzania, contributes to Rotary's campaign to eradicate polio, and has organized projects that provide refurbished mobility aids to people in developing countries.

The Rotary Club of Kraków

Few cities in Europe have preserved their cultural identity as remarkably as Kraków. Poland's former royal capital escaped much of the physical destruction of World War II, leaving one of Europe's finest medieval city centers. From Wawel Castle and St. Mary's Basilica to the historic Cloth



Hall overlooking the Vistula River, Kraków reflects centuries of history. Yet beneath its beauty lies a community shaped by resilience, rebuilding civic life after both war and decades of communist rule.

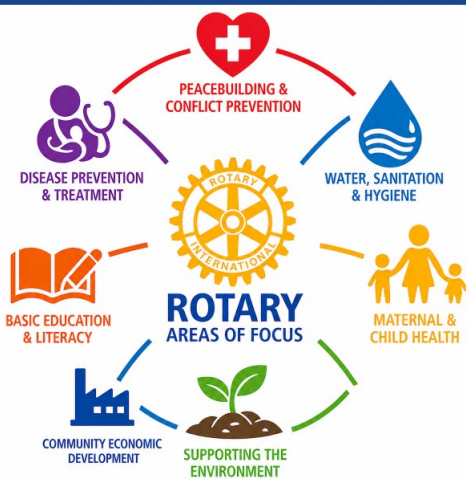
The Rotary Club of Kraków shares that story. Originally chartered in 1934, the club ceased operations during World War II and remained inactive throughout the communist era. Following Poland's return to democracy, Rotary returned to Kraków in 1990, and the club received a new Rotary International charter

on October 12, 1991. Today, it is part of District 2231 and has approximately 26 active members.

The club has long supported some of Kraków's most vulnerable residents. Members partner with the Care and Adoption Center in Żmijąca and its Kraków branch, helping provide resources and opportunities for children in need. They also support the historic Helclów Nursing Home, one of Poland's oldest elder care institutions, while responding to humanitarian needs throughout the region.

International friendship has become one of the club's defining strengths. Its partnership with the Rotary Club of Bielefeld, Germany, established soon after Rotary returned to Poland, has produced more than 25 years of joint humanitarian projects, medical equipment donations, and support for people with disabilities. The club also maintains sister-club relationships with Bari, Italy, and Lviv, Ukraine, providing humanitarian assistance to Ukrainians both in their homeland and to refugees in Poland. In 2024, more than 200 Rotarians gathered to celebrate the 90th anniversary of Rotary in Kraków, honoring a club whose friendships have helped reconnect the city with the global Rotary family.
